Funding for the new municipal pool has now reached \$3.34 million and we are excited to work on making this a reality. The selection process for a project engineer has begun.

Work is underway on construction of a walking trail connecting Rustic Park to the Bourke Street park property, which will be home to the new municipal pool.

MACON POLICE DEPARTMENT

The City purchased a new patrol vehicle in the end of 2021 and have two patrol vehicles on order that are estimated to arrive in April.

Over the past year, a focus has been on updating police equipment for officer safety. Officers are now equipped with body cameras thanks to a grant from our risk management pool. Additionally, we have upgraded our portable radios to MOSWIN capability, which allows our officers to communicate seamlessly with other public safety organizations around the state. Five radios were awarded through the State Homeland Security Program Grant and two radios were awarded through the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant.

Four mobile data terminals will be fully operational in April which allow officers the ability to access information roadside to provide efficiency and safety in the department.



STREET DEPARTMENT

The street department was able to utilize new equipment during the last snow event in Macon. The City purchased four V-Bed salt spreaders that are installed in the back of the snow removal trucks. This equipment upgrade allows us to be more efficient with de-icing material application and labor hours so we can cover more street surfaces spending less time and money. By salting the entire street, not just intersections and hills, we can improve our roadway conditions faster and provide safer travel around the community.

With warmer weather upon us, the street department will begin working on potholes, roadway patches, and storm drain/culvert cleanout and replacement.

Please be mindful of signs, barricades, and cones as you travel around work zones to help us keep the workers safe.

PUBLIC GROUNDS

Work continues on the new 18-hole disc golf course at Bourke Street park property. This includes concrete tee boxes on all 18 holes, installing baskets, clearing fairways for the nine wooded holes, and finishing the walking trail that connects to Rustic Park.

Blees Park will soon be home to a new six court pickleball facility in place of the existing double tennis court. The project has been awarded to McConnell & Associates who estimate completion in June. Lighting and resurfacing of the single tennis court will be completed as well.

The crew will begin spring cleaning and mowing of all City parks. As a reminder, please keep grass clipping of city streets and storm drains as they are a safety hazard for motorcycles and bicycles.
